Statement of intent

Our mission statement lies at the heart of our curriculum. Local Protocol

All schemes of work are created to carefully follow the National Curriculum and in RE lessons pupils follow the curriculum set out by the Bishops in England and Wales.

Aims and objectives

- 1. To give opportunities for pupils to develop their love for their neighbour and promote a cohesive community.
- 2. To plan for pupils to nurture their faith, their prayer life and to support their moral development.
- 3. To provide programmes of study that contain appropriate challenge and rigour.
- 4. To plan classroom activities that ensure that pupils are knowledgeable, confident, literate, and independent problem-solvers.
- 5. To ensure that the quality of teaching leads to excellent progress by pupils during their time at school.
- 6. To provide classroom activities that develop pupils' knowledge to ensure that pupils are able to safeguard themselves.
- 7. To give opportunities for pupils to learn how to make healthy choices.
- 8. To nurture pupils' understanding of self-worth and appropriate relationships through a comprehensive relationships and sex education programme.
- 9. To provide pupils with the necessary cultural capital through classroom activities, an excellent extra-curricular programme and opportunities for school trips.
- 10. To provide skills that pupils need for future learning: resilience, a growth mind set and perseverance.
- 11. To educate pupils in the importance and worth of British Values.
- 12. To plan opportunities in the curriculum for pupils to learn about different cultures and to celebrate the diversity of pupils across the Trust.
